

As a business strategist for the past decade, Lisa helps entrepreneurs and companies all over the world use their story to grow their business. In 2020, posed with a challenge in her mastermind group to set a ten-year goal and draw it out on paper, a one woman show came to life when **she started to think about her legacy.**


Having been an Intensive Care and End of Life Care Nurse prior to owning her branding and marketing company, Lisa helped many people as they confronted death and had a crash course in regret. **In just one year's time**, during a global pandemic, Lisa learned how to sing, act, and write, and transform her personal story about how she disentangled from an overhearing narcissistic mother.



What if 'too big' turns out to be exactly the right size?



This award-winning, partly autobiographical, solo musical follows heroine Luna as she tries to make the right choices in life, while being undermined at every turn by her overbearing, narcisstic mother. Who will win in the inner struggle between her Shame, which drives her to bulimia and alcohol abuse, and her Warrioress alter ego, who urges her to fight back against her mother's toxicity?



Both hilarious and heartbreaking, Too Big For Her Britches is written and performed by Lisa Pezik, who plays all 20 characters, as well as delivering 11 instantly hummable original songs, composed for the show with Drew Lawrence, whose music has been recorded by Lea Michele, Leona Lewis and Shane Filan (Westlife), amongst many others.

Directed by Heather Dowling, Too Big For Her Britches has won awards at several fringe festivals and most recently, enjoyed two successful runs at New York's Off-Broadway Theatre Row.



TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

STAGE: 3 by 4m, 10-15 feet.

SET: 3 Set pieces in total. DSL a chair or block, DSC a chair or block, DSR a

bench or 3 blocks put together to form a bench. Very minimal set and

typically use what's on hand at the theatre.

LIGHTING: Preferred looks: Washes, both cool and warm in DSL, DSR, DSC. Have

run the show very basic with a 10 light panel and advanced with a

100-light panel in theatres with LED's and Gobos.

SOUND: Does require a sound system to plug into for backing tracks and minimal

sound cues. Programmed in Qlab and Multiplay.

OPERATOR: The production does require a tech operator for lights and sound.

Too Big For Her Britches was designed with an ease of travel with green earth practices using minimal set props that theatres have on hand, digital programs and press kits and basic lights and sound cues.

Lisa has toured internationally to the Hollywood Fringe Festival, SoloFest, Hamilton Ontario Fringe, Off-Broadway at United Solo off Theatre Row in New York City, and Edinburgh Fringe.
